

### **Awareness Webinar**





## **Updates**

#### Moula Ali Road Construction

During a site visit to the ongoing road construction at Moula Ali on 15 Sep 2022 by our Architect Shankar Narayan, Frauke Quader and young architects from Urban Labs together with the EE of GHMC B. Gopal (in charge of the construction) and his team, the continuation of the road was discussed. After the high retaining walls which are disturbing the view of the majestic rock dome so badly, are taken as a done deed, it was assured that the remaining road will now follow the profile of the slope till the top where a parking space will come up near the existing transmission tower. This part of the road will have small parapet walls, though the excavation for their foundations will still have to be dug 1 m into the solid rock.

#### Fakhruddingutta (Khajaguda Rocks)

While we are still waiting for the land Survey of Fakhruddingutta to be carried out by the authorities so that fencing can be done, we found out during a visit to the hill on 19 Aug 2022, with Ritwik Reddy and Chanakya from the Hyderabad Adventure Club (who both are very efficiently tracking the government follow-up) that the alignment of the road being constructed at the back of the hill has indeed been shifted away from the rocky foot hills, as was one of our demands. The Engineer in charge Mr. Murli Krishna from the Road Development Corp. and Contractor Mr. Madhu explained the new lay-out and assured us that no more rocks will be cut in the hill. On the western side, though, a big swathe of flat land falling in the protected survey nos. is being readied for development. Though construction in the area has been explicitly prohibited by the latest court order, the temple area is also building up at a fast pace.

# "Other Kohinoors - The Rocks of Hyderabad" Screening

Filmmakers Uma Magal and Mahnoor Yar Khan completed their elaborate cinematic work "Other Kohinoors - The Rocks of Hyderabad" (45 min.) After much research into the topic of the astounding rocky landscape of our city being a vibrant part of the local culture, they created a beautiful pictorial history of rocks in painting, poetry, music, language and even food of the Deccan.

With lively musical accompaniment, the film is captivating and inspiring, despite the underlying sad note of the rampant destruction of our rocky environment. The film was launched at Prasad's Imax Auditorium on 04 September 2022 to a dense crowd of enthusiastic Hyderabadis and visitors. The film is being screened on request at schools and colleges.
