



KONDA GORRE

a walk embracing Nature's abundance

With a tag line that reads "The good, wild Earth" an invitation to the Konda Gorre Rewilding Project from P.Raghuveer, MD, TSFDC and A. Ravinder Reddy, General Manager, Telangana State Forest Development Corp. Ltd (TSFDC) could scarcely have been passed up by us Society members, all eager for a Covid escape! Specially not on a bright cool Sunday in December and what with the opportunity to be one of the first visitors to the park that had a soft launch just two weeks prior.

A group of 13 Society members escorted by K.Shireesha, Divisional Manager and her team

ventured into the park. Some chose to use the bicycles provided while others followed by foot. Of course, our eyes were mostly on the lookout for rocky outcrops which we soon found and scrambled up. Our member Vijay did his trademark bare hands bouldering much to the amusement of park authorities. The hosts soon realized that we were keen on rocks and they took us to two more rock sites which we thoroughly enjoyed. We visited the crystal clear pond, peaceful cycling paths, even the man made Shiva shrine with an interesting over hanging

rock formation that housed a swallow nest intricately designed in Mud. The two hour introduction to the park was sufficient to entice us to revisit. We were treated to a hot breakfast by our generous host which was followed by a formal introduction by Mr P.Raghuveer and interaction with the Project team on their upcoming plans.

Named after the four horned antelope that inhabits this area, Konda Gorre has been developed in the Lalgadi Malakpet Forest Block, Shameerpet in collaboration with the NGO Chitrak, with the aim of being completely sustainable. The natural landscape is being preserved,

rocks and water bodies conserved, no vehicles or plastics allowed. Anand Vishwanadha, Chief Sustainability Officer is focused on Konda Gorre providing livelihoods to people from the surrounding areas. He said, "we want to promote everything local and native to this area, be it planting more native trees or promoting local cuisine, craft and talent."

Well worth a visit, only 30 kms from Hyderabad, safe and eco friendly. Few rocks but in these covid times, nothing like the perfect outdoors for some soul time!
