THE DECCAN ROCKS CELEBRATED BY METRO RAIL Photo Exhibition 5th to 7th February

The Society to Save Rocks, in collaboration with L&T Metro Rail and with assistance of event managers Tatva Arts held a photo exhibition titled "Deccan Rocks" at the Ameerpet Metro Station from February 5th to 7th. The 50 photos of the most stunning rock formations on display were taken by the Society's Life member Mr. Ashok Kumar Vootla. This is the first time that an exhibition of rock photos was held at any of the Metro stations in the city.

The exhibition was inaugurated by KVB Reddy, Managing Director, L&T Metro Rail. Murali Varadarajan, Chief Strategy Officer and other top officers of the management were also present at the event which had been carefully prepared by Mr. Narendranath, Corp. Communications, and Mr. Surender, Station Officer. The Hyderabad Rockathon 2024 was organized by the Society and the Great Hyderabad Adventure Club(GHAC) at the Forestrek Park, Narsingi on February 11th. The events were flagged off by Dr. G. Chandrasekhar Reddy, MD, TSFDC. This 10th Edition of the Rockathon had a footfall of about a 150 participants who thoroughly enjoyed the adventure-filled day in the picturesque site which has boulders, walkways in Nature and three lakes. As always, the highlights were the Rappelling and Ziplining which commenced at 9am and had people queuing up well after 3pm ! Besides the Rock Walks, Rock Shotput, games and Slacklining, Rock Balancing by Maanasi Shankar drew the attention of both kids and adults.

The Snake Awareness session had a captive audience and the little kids sat up close without flinching to watch the fascinating reptiles shown by the Friends of Snakes who answered many questions and helped us see these reptiles in a new light. The Rock Balancing, Rock Art and the Rock Quiz had a good participation too. EXCURSION TO HAMPI - 17th & 18th February

Malini Siruguri reports - "Our trip to Hampi with the Society to Save Rocks was a jam-packed weekend of fun. The adventure began right at our meeting point in Kacheguda station on the evening of February 16th the moment that we found out we were going to change trains in the middle of the night - a kind of surprise I've learnt must be expected out of these trips! Soon after arriving at our dormitory - a set of rooms furnished with bunk beds! - we were fresh and fed, and climbed excitedly into our minibus and jeeps, ready for some rocks. (continued)

Our trek began at the foot of Matanga Hill, by accompanied a friendly doa who disappeared once the uneven stone steps gave way to the Deccan's beloved boulders. Stopping often to take in the sight of the dusty but splendorous ruins contrasting with green groves of coconut trees, we made our way through the sun baked granite jungle to Matanga's peak, where a small derelict temple stands. We rested here, and some clicked pictures while others explored the crevices between the rocks.





Once back on the ground, we made a beeline to a coconut stand, after which we scattered in search of food and coracle rides. It wasn't until the end of our post-lunch sightseeing that we all gathered at the parking (with sticks of ice cream in hand), from where we set off to watch the sunset. The next morning, we headed to see Hampi's historic stone chariot and the magnificent Vittala temple, followed by a trip to what was once Vijayanagara's royal centre. Here, we marveled at the architecture of the intricately carved stone platform and the channel-fed stepped tank. We reached Hyderabad at 3:00 am and dispersed after sleepy goodbyes, no doubt already looking forward to the next trip!"
